#### FORTHCOMING EVENTS

On **Tuesday October 28<sup>th</sup>** we're presenting a special certificate to Ian Blair, licensee of the Ship and Castle, High Street, Aberystwyth to mark the pub's 10 consecutive appearances in the Good Beer Guide (2006-2015 editions). The presentation will take place in the Ship and Castle at around 7pm – the pub's beer festival will be in full swing, so I hope to see a good turnout.

## **BEER FESTIVALS**

This autumn's festival at the **Ship and Castle** in Aberystwyth takes place from **Tuesday 28<sup>th</sup> to Thursday 30th October**, 2pm to midnight both days. Highly recommended as ever. Birmingham Beer & Cider Festival has a new venue this year: New Bingley Hall, Hockley Circus, near Jewellery Quarter Station. It runs from **Wednesday 29<sup>th</sup> October to Saturday 1<sup>st</sup> November**. The Wednesday evening session, starting 6pm, is for Camra members and invited guests only; the other three days it opens 11am. Shrewsbury Beer Festival takes place at Morris Hall on Bellstone in the town centre from **Thursday 6th to Saturday 8th November** (from noon all three days, but closing 9pm on Saturday). It's a small venue, so getting there early in the day is recommended. And there's a pub beer festival at the Three Horseshoes at Cenarth on **Saturday and Sunday 15<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> November**, with 6 or 7 local beers.
